

○ **AAS EXIT OPTIONS**

To complete the requirements of their degree, MAAS students have the following three options:

- Option A: Thesis (70+ pages)
- Option B: Non-Thesis Master’s Essay (40 pages)
- Option C: Non-Thesis Research Essay (20 pages) plus Self-Study (20 pages)

Mid-course in the program (15 credits) the student is required to meet with Dr. Heine, Asian Studies Program Director, to discuss his/her exit option – Option A, B, or C.

If a joint decision is made to select Option A: Thesis, the student must take responsibility to find three graduate faculty members who will form the advisory committee (see faculty list below). Dr. Heine, Program Director, can serve as the primary advisor, a committee member, or as a representative of the Asian Studies Program.

If Option B: Non-Thesis Master’s Essay or Option C: Non-Thesis Research Essay plus Self-Study is selected, to what extent a committee is required will be determined in consultation with the Program Director.

Please note that the UGS deadlines are the last possible dates to submit. Therefore, if there are issues with the forms, turning them in last minute may result in delayed graduation.

*These are the dates forms are due TO the University Graduate School. Students must also meet departmental and college deadlines. Failure to meet these deadlines could delay graduation. Consult with the College website or your Graduate Program Director for this information. Ultimately, it is the student's responsibility to make sure forms are received by the University Graduate School on time.

All defenses must be held no earlier than the first Friday and no later than the last Friday in a given semester.

For Spring 2018, the earliest date would be 01/12/18;

For Summer 2018, the earliest date would be 05/11/18

FORM M-1 should be submitted by master's students as soon as the thesis committee has been formed.

FORM M-1 should typically be submitted one semester before FORM M-2 but no later than the deadline: TWO semesters before the anticipated graduation term.

FORM M-2 should be submitted by master's students no later than the deadline: ONE semester before the anticipated graduation term.

FORM M-3 must be submitted to the University Graduate School at least 3 weeks before the date of the defense or by the deadline (whichever date is earlier).
