

The Cross-Strait relation between Taiwan and Mainland China has become complicated and intense after Tsai Ing-wen, leader of the Democratic Progressive Party (DPP), took power in Taiwan in May 2017. The peace and stability of cross-Taiwan Strait and China's diplomacy towards Taiwan meet new challenges. President Trump's new policy towards China and Taiwan also brings a subtle change to the external environment of the Cross-Strait relation. In this situation, what new strategies and new policies would Chinese President XI Jinping adopt and what new measures he would take to face the new changes?
