- ❖ Be specific in your search and applications. Apply for as many things as possible, but make sure they fit your interests.
- Make sure to keep track of **deadlines**. Some internship applications require certain documents at an earlier date than the main deadline.





Japan Teaching-Exchange Program

- ❖ JET is a Japanese government initiative that brings college (university) graduates—mostly native speakers of English—to Japan as Assistant Language Teachers (ALTs) and Sports Education Advisors (SEAs) in Japanese kindergartens, elementary, junior high and high schools, or as Coordinators for International Relations (CIRs) in local governments and boards of education.
- ❖ JET participants are placed in contracting organizations throughout Japan. Contracting organizations consist of 47 prefectural and 20 designated city governments, individual city, town and village governments, and some private schools. JET participants sign their terms and conditions with their contracting organization and as such, they are under the jurisdiction of the local authority which employs them. CLAIR implements the JET Program at the national level in conjunction with three Japanese Ministries.


EPIK (English Program in Korea)

- In affiliation with the Korean Ministry of Education, EPIK was established in 1995. EPIK's mission is to educate improve English language abilities of students and teachers, develop cultural exchange between Korea and countries around the world, and introducing new teaching methods to the Korean education system.
- ► EPIK requires that applicants are citizens of a country where English is the primary language, hold a Bachelors Degree from an accredited university, stands in good health, strong background in the English language, the interest and ability to adapt to Korean culture and life.
- Applications are open twice per year, for submission in the Spring term, please apply in August of the Previous year and for submission in the Fall term, please apply in February of that year.

Benjamin A. Gilman Scholarship

- ❖ The Gilman Scholarship Program offers awards for undergraduate study abroad and was established by the International Academic Opportunity Act of 2000. This scholarship provides awards for U.S. undergraduate students who are receiving Federal Pell Grant funding at a two-year or four-year college or university to participate in study abroad programs worldwide.
- ❖ The Gilman Scholarship Program accepts applications two times per year. Ideally, students should begin their application one full semester before their study abroad program is scheduled to begin.

Blakemore Freeman Fellowships

- ❖ The Blakemore Foundation was established in 1990 by Thomas and Frances Blakemore to encourage the advanced study of Asian languages and to improve the understanding of Asian fine arts in the United States.
- ❖ Blakemore Freeman Fellowships are awarded for one academic year of advanced level language study in East or Southeast Asia in approved language programs.
- **Eligible languages**: Burmese, Chinese, Indonesian, Khmer, Korean, Japanese, Thai, Vietnamese

- ❖ Boren Fellowships provide up to \$30,000 to U.S. graduate students to add an important international and language component to their graduate education through specialization in area study, language study, or increased language proficiency.
- ❖ Boren Fellowships support study and research in areas of the world that are critical to U.S. interests.

Bridge Award

- ❖ The NSEP Bridge Award Fellowship is a cooperative initiative of The National Bureau of Asian Research (NBR), the Institute of International Education (IIE), and the National Security Education Program (NSEP). This award seeks to equip and empower Boren Fellows with the analytical and practical skills helpful to pursuing Asia-focused public service careers.
- Responsibilities include conference and meeting organization, editing and proofreading, research and writing, fundraising and corporate development support, outreach, website editing and database work, and general office support. Boren Fellows will have opportunities to gain further knowledge of Asia within their regional or functional areas of interest, to work within an organization that is focused on policy-relevant research, and to become better acquainted with the U.S. foreign policy process.

Brookings Institution

- ❖ The Foreign Policy program at the Brookings Institution invites applications for the award of one or two resident fellowships for policy-oriented doctoral research.
- ❖ Awards will go to individuals whose research is near completion and will benefit from access to Foreign Policy scholars and the Washington policy-making community afforded by the Brookings Institution.
- ❖ The fellowship carries a stipend of \$27,000, payable in installments over a nine-month period of full-time residency at Brookings.

Charles B. Rangel International Affairs Graduate Fellowships

- ❖ The Rangel Program is a collaborative effort between Howard University and the U.S. State Department that seeks to attract and prepare outstanding young people for careers as diplomats in the Foreign Service of the U.S. Department of State.
- ❖ Each year, the Rangel Program selects 20 outstanding Rangel Fellows in a highly competitive nationwide process and helps support them through two years of graduate study, internships and professional development activities, and entry into the Foreign Service.

❖ The International Affairs Fellowship Program is designed to advance the professional development of outstanding young Americans between the ages of 27 and 35. Democracy Fellows Program

- ❖ World Learning's Democracy Fellows Program assists the advancement of democratic practices in emerging and transitional democracies by placing field experienced democracy and governance professionals at USAID Missions and Bureaus.
- ❖ The program supports up to 15 Democracy Fellowships annually, generally awarding six new fellowships each year. Fellows participate in assignments at USAID's field missions abroad or in Washington, D.C. to gain practical skills.

FLAS Fellowships

- ❖ The Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) Fellowships program provides allocations of academic year and summer fellowships to institutions of higher education or consortia of institutions of higher education to assist meritorious undergraduate students and graduate students undergoing training in modern foreign languages and related area or international studies. Eligible students apply for fellowships directly to an institution that has received an allocation of fellowships from the U.S. Department of Education.
- ❖ The estimated subsistence allowance for an academic year 2010-2011 fellowship is \$15,000 for a graduate student and \$5,000 for an undergraduate student. The subsistence allowance for a summer 2011 fellowship is \$2,500 for graduate and undergraduate students.

Freeman-ASIA Awards

- ❖ Freeman-ASIA accepts applications from U.S. citizens or permanent residents studying at the undergraduate level at a two-year or four-year college or university who demonstrate financial need to study abroad in East or Southeast Asia. The award provides need-based funding to assist the recipient with the cost of the study abroad program and related expenses, including airfare, basic living costs, local transportation, books, etc.
- ❖ Interested students should apply to Freeman-ASIA in the academic term before their study abroad program begins. Applications must also be endorsed by both the study abroad adviser and the financial aid adviser by the specified deadline.

Fulbright Fellowships

- ❖ Sponsored by the U.S. Department of State
- ❖ The largest U.S. international exchange program offering opportunities for students, scholars, and professionals to undertake international graduate study, advanced research, university teaching, and teaching in elementary and secondary schools worldwide.
- ❖ Was established in 1946 by the U.S. Congress to "enable the government of the United States to increase mutual understanding between the people of the United States and the people of other countries."

Gorton Center Fellows and Internship Program

- ❖ The Slade Gorton International Policy Center will establish a fellowship and internship program that will recruit promising young professionals to groom them in former U.S. Senator Slade Gorton's values and provide them with policy experience at the Gorton Center and on staff in U.S. Senate offices.
- ❖ NBR provides exceptional internship and fellowship opportunities for the purposes of attracting and training the next generation of Asia specialists.

- ❖ Established in memory of Alan R. and Barbara D. Finberg, early supporters of Human Rights Watch, this fellowship is open to graduates (at the Master's level) in the fields of law, journalism, international relations, or other relevant studies. Other relevant disciplines may also be considered.
- ❖ Stipends of up to \$47,000 are awarded per year of fellowship.

International Development Fellows

- ❖ The CRS International Development Fellows Program is intended to give people who are interested in a career in international relief and development an opportunity to increase their overseas experience and gain broad exposure to CRS programs. Each year, CRS has approximately 20 placements with our country programs (based overseas). Assignments are for one year.
- Specific job responsibilities vary greatly from one country to another depending on the country program's focus (Agriculture, Health, Peace building, Education, Microfinance, social assistance or a combination of these). The goal of the IDFP is to place Fellows in positions where they can draw on their previous education and work experience, while broadening their skills.

National Endowment for Humanities Fellowships

- ❖ Fellowships support individuals pursuing advanced research that is of value to humanities scholars, general audiences, or both.
- ❖ Fellowships cover periods lasting from six to twelve months at a stipend of \$4,200 per month in outright funds. The maximum stipend is \$50,400 in outright funds for a twelve-month period.

The Next Generation Fellowship in Asian Affairs Program

- ❖ The Next Generation Fellowship is a post-master's degree program that is cultivating a new generation of Asian affairs specialists committed to and capable of bridging the gap between the best scholarly research and the pressing needs of U.S. foreign policy toward a rapidly changing Asia.
- ❖ This one-year fellowship is designed to further the professional development of Asia specialists in the year just after the completion of their master's degree.

Postdoctoral Fellowship for Transregional Research

- ❖ A postdoctoral fellowship program that will support transregional research under the rubric Inter-Asian Contexts and Connections. Its purpose is to strengthen the understanding of issues and geographies that don't fit neatly into existing divisions of academia or the world and to develop new approaches, practices, and opportunities in international, regional, and area studies in the United States.
- ❖ These fellowships will help junior scholars (those at the postdoctoral stage, one to seven years out of the Ph.D.) complete first books and/or undertake second projects. In addition to funding research, the program will create networks that will support Fellows well beyond the grant period.

Presidential Management Fellowship

- ❖ The purpose of the Presidential Management Fellowship (PMF) Program is to attract to the Federal service outstanding men and women from a variety of academic disciplines and career paths who have a clear interest in, and commitment to, excellence in the leadership and management of public policies and programs.
- ❖ Prestigious two year paid government fellowship sponsored by Office of Personnel Management (OPM) for recent graduate students who seek a two year fellowship in United States government agency.

Thomas R. Pickering Graduate Foreign Affairs Fellowship

- ❖ The Thomas R. Pickering Graduate Foreign Affairs
 Fellowship program provides funding to participants as
 they are prepared academically and professionally to enter
 the United States Department of State Foreign Service.
- ❖ 2011 Fellowships included financial support of up to \$50,000 annually towards tuition and mandatory fees (excluding health insurance), and a living stipend (based on the institution's room and board rate). Reimbursement for books and some travel may be paid during the first and second year of graduate study, pending availability of funding.
