Teachers, students, organizations with an interest in Japan, and the general public will be able to access resources chronicling the breadth and depth of our ties via our digital collection.

The Ties That Bind map of the United States, housed on Historypin (historypin.org) will be populated with information – photographs, primary source documents and narratives – that highlights the relationship between the United States and East Asia. Supplementary materials, including bibliographies and additional resources, along with announcements for project-related events are posted on the Historypin site.
