M.A. IN ASIAN STUDIES

The Asian Studies M.A. requires 30 graduate credits. The is an interdisciplinary program that draws on faculty from the Steven J Green School of International and Public Affairs and professional schools at FIU. The courses are coordinated by Asian Studies, which also sponsors workshops, lectures, cultural events, and study abroad programs. The M.A. program provides students with a rich learning experience about a fascinating and increasingly important region of the world, and is intended to enhance the student's competitiveness upon graduation. The program provides a multidisciplinary approach covering the philosophy, religion, art history, language and literature of Asia as well as issues in history, politics, geography, sociology/anthropology, and international relations. It requires 9 credits in Core Courses, 15 credits in Other Coursework, and one of two graduate Exit Options: (1) ASN 6972 Thesis (6 credits) that require important FIU Graduate School forms, thesis guidelines, and deadlines; or (II) ASN 6912 Master's Essay in Asian Studies (3 credits) with additional graduate level Asia-Specific Course (3 credits), totaling 6 credits (see below).
