FIU ASIAN STUDIES PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS CHECKLIST

B.A. IN ASIAN STUDIES

The Asian Studies B.A. requires 36 credits. It is designed to allow students to focus on Asian political economy and culture in the context of global studies, as well as East Asian languages. However, all students must earn 120 credits in order to be eligible for graduation. The Asian Studies major requires 6 credits of Core & Capstone Courses: Introduction to East Asia (ASN 3410); and a supervised research course, either Dynamics of Asia ASN 4510, Modern Asia ASN 4390, or equivalent 4000-level course (see below). Next, 9 credits in Asian Studies Courses (with ASN-prefix) and 9 credits of other Asia-Related Courses. In addition, each student must choose 6 credits of a Main Concentration/Track: [A] Asian Area Studies; [B] East Asian Studies; [C] Asian World Affairs. Because language is paramount to understanding culture, students must achieve 6 credits of an Asian language (e.g., Japanese, Chinese, Korean). The level of proficiency required will depend on the main concentration chosen. Students may receive credits through Study Abroad courses or an internship program. *Note the following language requirements based on selection of Main Concentration/Track:

[A] Asian Area Studies or [B] East Asian Studies Tracks: Two semesters (6 credits) of Intermediate-level (2000) or higher in Chinese, Japanese, Korean or other Asian Language. For most students, this will require a prerequisite of Introductory-level (1000) courses or demonstrating proficiency through testing, interview, etc.
[C] Asian World Affairs Track: Two semesters (6 credits) of Introductory-level (1000) or higher in Chinese, Japanese, Korean or other Asian Language. (First year language courses are 5-credits each, for a total of 10, but 6 credits will be applied to the track total).

Students must choose <u>one</u> of the following **Main Concentrations**:

[A] Asian Area Studies Main Concentration/Track (6 credits of Asian Area courses; ASN-prefix preferred)	Term/Grade

* For the Asian Area Studies track, this could include area studies and/or language courses. This track emphasizes language studies and regional studies in political economy or cultural history, and language competency.

[B] East Asian Studies Main Concentration/Track (6 credits of Asian language)	Term/Grade

* For the East Asian Studies track, this must be **one year in a** <u>second</u> Asian language. This track emphasizes more advanced language studies in Chinese, Japanese, Korean or other Asian language.

* For the Asian World Affairs track, this could include courses in contemporary and/or comparative Asian issues. This track emphasizes the role of the Asian region in contemporary world affairs, and only requires introductory-level language knowledge.

Please note: No more than two courses (6 credits) from the Asian Studies B.A. degree can be counted towards one of the program's undergraduate certificates. A grade of "C" or better is required for all courses (C- is not acceptable)

Review catalog regarding the **Combined BA/MA in Asian Studies Degree Pathway:** To be considered for admission to the combined bachelor's/master's degree pathway, students must have completed at least 75 credits in the B.A. degree program at FIU and meet the admissions criteria for the M.A. degree program to which they are applying.
