Asian Studies Program Requirements Checklist

➤ B.A. in Asian Studies/Japanese Area Studies Major ➤

To enter the Asian Studies Program, fill out the appropriate paperwork with the university to state your major plan of study. Completion of the Asian Studies Program takes only 36 credits; however, all students must earn 120 credits in their undergraduate career in order to be eligible for graduation.

There are a few requirements that students must meet to complete the Asian Studies Bachelor's Degree with the Japanese Area Studies Major. Students are required to complete Introduction to East Asia (ASN 3410), History of Japan (ASH 3440), and Japanese Culture and Society (JPN 3500). Students must also complete two capstone/seminar courses: East Asian Civilizations and Cultures (ASH 4300) and either Dynamics of Asia (ASN 4510) or Modern Asia (ASN 4390) (*or equivalent*). Japanese Area Studies Majors must also complete 9 credits of Japanese or Asian Area Studies electives.

Because understanding language is paramount to understanding culture, students must achieve an advanced level (12 credits) of the Japanese language (first year of language, JPN 1130 and JPN 1131, are considered prerequisites). If a student tests out of language courses, s/he must fulfill the requirements with additional course work. Contact asian@fiu.edu for more information.
